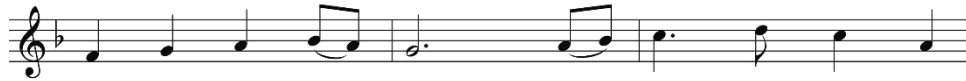





### **MT 16:13-20**

*A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew*

Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi and he asked his disciples,

He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?"
