


Vespers

INTRODUCTION

Leader: God, + come to my assistance.

All: Lord, make haste to help me.

Leader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit:

All: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen. Alleluia.

PSALMODY

Psalm 116:10-19 Thanksgiving in the Temple

Through Christ let us offer God a continual sacrifice of praise (Hebrews 13:15)

Antiphon:

Leader: My life is at the service of the Gospel;
All: God has given me this gift of his grace.

Leader: I trusted, even when I said:

"I am sorely afflicted," and when I said in my alarm: "No man can be trusted."

All: How can I repay the Lord for his goodness to me?
The cup of salvation I will raise;

Psalm Prayer

Psalm 126 Joyful hope in God

Just as you share in sufferings, so you will share in the divine glory. (2 Corinthians 1:7)

Antiphon

READING: Colossians 1:3–6a

GOSPEL CANTICLE

Canticle of Mary: Luke 1:46-55

You set your Son at your right hand in the heavens,
— open the gates of your kingdom to those who have died.
Lord, remember your Church.

THE LORD'S PRAYER
