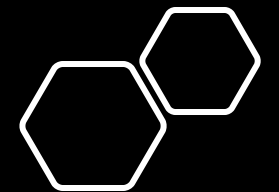

PSALMODY

Psalm 41: Prayer of a sick person

One of you will betray me, yes, one who eats with me (Mark 14:18).

Antiphon:

Leader: Lord, lay your healing hand upon me,

All: **for I have sinned.**

Leader: Happy the man who considers the poor and the weak.
The Lord will save him in the day of evil,
will guard him, give him life, make him happy in the land and
will not give him up to the will of his foes.
The Lord will help him on his bed of pain,

He shall be called Emmanuel, which means: God-with-us (Matthew 1:23).
