


Vespers

INTRODUCTION

Leader: God, + come to my assistance.

All: Lord, make haste to help me.

Leader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit:

All: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen. Alleluia.

PSALMODY

Psalm 135: Praise for the wonderful things God does for us

He has won us for himself. . . and you must proclaim what he has done for you. He has called you out of darkness into his own wonderful light (1 Peter 2:9).

Antiphon:

Leader: Our King will come from Zion;

All: the Lord, God-is-with-us, is his mighty name.

Leader: Praise the name of the Lord, praise him, servants of the Lord, who stand in the house of the Lord in the courts of the house of our God.

All: Praise the Lord for the Lord is good. Sing a psalm to his name for he is loving. For the Lord has chosen Jacob for himself and Israel for his own possession.

For I know the Lord is great, that our Lord is high above all gods. The Lord does whatever he wills, in heaven, on earth, in the seas.

He summons clouds from the ends of the earth; makes lightning produce the rain; from his treasuries he sends forth the wind.

The first-born of the Egyptians he smote, of man and beast alike.

Signs and wonders he worked in the midst of your land, O Egypt, against Pharaoh and all his servants.

Nations in their greatness he struck and kings in their splendor he slew. Sihon, king of the Amorites, Og, the king of Bashan, and all the kingdoms of Canaan. He let Israel inherit their land; on his people their land he bestowed.

Psalm 135 (Part 2)

Antiphon:

Leader: Wait for the Lord

All: and he will come to you with his saving power.

Lord, your name stands for ever, unforgotten from age to age: for the Lord does justice for his people; the Lord takes pity on his servants.

Pagan idols are silver and gold, the work of human hands. They have mouths but they cannot speak; they have eyes but they cannot see.

Who would dare refuse you honor, or the glory due your name, O Lord?

Antiphon

Leader: Eagerly I watch for the Lord;

READING: 1 Corinthians 1:7b-9

Reader: We await the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ, who will strengthen us to the end, so that we will be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful, and it was he who called us to fellowship with his Son.

RESPONSORY

Reader: Come and set us free, Lord God of power and might.

All: Come and set us free, Lord God of power and might.

Let your face shine upon us and we shall be saved,

Lord God of power and might.

GOSPEL CANTICLE

Canticle of Mary: Luke 1:46-55 *The soul rejoices in the Lord*

Leader: O Key of David, O royal Power of Israel, controlling at your will the gate of heaven:

All: come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death; and lead your captive people into freedom.

My + soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant.
